School Mission Statement and Ethos

At Ditcham Park School our mission is to nurture and encourage each child to learn and progress within a supportive environment so that our pupils develop into confident young people who go out into the world with the skills and desire to improve it.

Our ethos whereby 'Every child is known and Valued' is founded on outstanding pastoral care, excellent teaching and an all-round approach to education.

History & Situation

Ditcham Park School is situated near Petersfield, Hampshire in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty on top of the South Downs with spectacular views of the rolling Hampshire hills and south across the Solent as far as the Isle of Wight.

The main building originated as a hunting lodge in the 18th century and developed into a 1000 acre estate by the 19th century. In 1886 the main building burnt down and was rebuilt as we see it today.

In the Second World War the building was commandeered by the Ministry of Defence and used as a rehabilitation centre for injured servicemen.

After the Second World War it became a Boys Preparatory Catholic Boarding School for Douai Abbey Senior School. It closed in 1975.

In 1976 the school was bought by our Founder, Patricia (Paddy) Holmes who was a teacher working in Portsmouth. She had become disillusioned with the new Comprehensive System of education and its one size fits all approach. She decided to set up Ditcham Park School where 'one size would NOT fit all' and where 'every child would be known and valued'. She opened the School in September 1976 with 100 pupils on roll. The School has gone from strength to strength and now has a pupil roll of 420.

The School is a registered charity. The directors of the charitable association are its Governors. The current Chair of Governors is Roger Overend and the current Headmaster is Graham Spawforth.

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Ditcham Park School Today

Ditcham Park School is a thriving Independent Co-Educational Day School for pupils aged rising 3 to 16 with a pupil roll of 420. It is a member of the Independent Schools Association (ISA).

The School is organised in 3 parts:

- A Pre-School and Reception class for pupils aged rising 3 to 5
- A Junior School for pupils in Yr1 to Yr6
- A Senior School for pupils in Yr7 to Yr11

Leadership & Governance
