Children in Reception to Middles had spooktacular fun and frolics at the FDPS Halloween Party.


Prep linked their topic of Space with the 25th Anniversary of National Poetry Day and wrote some inspiring poems:



Atticus Marks took his first victory in the U14s at the Southern Enduro 'OECP Mashup' at Queen Elizabeth Country Park.




Congratulations to Seb Hopkins for being offered a seat to drive in next year's Ginetta Junior Racing Championship.
